## Global Vaccine Impact Conference

**Gavi's Global Vaccine Impact Conference marks the mid-point in the 2021-2025 cycle and provides the platform for leaders of partner countries and other members of the Alliance to report back on progress against the commitments and assess performance and impact.**

The Conference is co-hosted by H.E. Mr José Manuel Albares Bueno, Spanish Minister for Foreign Affairs, EU, and Cooperation and Professor José Manuel Barroso, Chair of the Board of Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, under the patronage of H.E. Pedro Sánchez Pérez-Castejón, the Prime Minister of Spain, in Madrid, from 13 to 15 June 2023.

Stress tested through the worst global pandemic for over a century, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, has demonstrated the power of robust, flexible, and innovative partnership. Since its inception, the Alliance has supported countries to protect generations - more than one billion children, as well as adolescents and adults - from potentially fatal diseases.

Gavi committed in 2019 to supporting countries prevent disease with vaccines to protect the next generation and ensure countries can prosper through the most

comprehensive package of protection by vaccines to lower income countries. This commitment was endorsed in June 2020 by 42 heads of state and government and other world leaders, who also called upon COVAX to respond to the devastating COVID-19 pandemic by extending that protection to include COVID-19 vaccines. Donors committed an unprecedented US\$ 10.5 billion to support Gavi's 2021-2025 Investment Opportunity.

We look forward to assessing what we have collectively achieved so far, to learn from the challenges we have faced, and to chart a course for the next phase.

Gavi has pioneered innovative solutions and accelerated the uptake of vaccines, both in times of opportunity and crisis. The pandemic has had a devastating impact, particularly on already-vulnerable populations. Yet, countries have continued to work hard with Gavi and partners to save lives and achieve ambitious vaccination targets.

Gavi's CEO Dr Seth Berkley will address Gavi's results, showcase how the Gavi Alliance navigated through the pandemic and reflect on how the Alliance is preparing for a future of poly-crisis.

The global health community is gathered in Madrid to imagine the future, how to ensure that the next generation will be protected against life-threatening diseases and together address how to jointly work towards these objectives.

<b>15:30–17:00</b> Plenary	<b>Two Challenges, One Fight: Climate Change and Pandemic Preparedness and Response</b>  The COVID-19 pandemic has been the greatest test of the Alliance model in its 23-year history. The robustness and flexibility built into the Alliance has allowed us to respond decisively to the pandemic. But we need to learn from the experience of the last two years and unlock new tools and partnerships to catch up and expand immunisation for the world's most vulnerable people. At the same time, climate change is creating the conditions for diseases to spread, damaging health infrastructure and increasing disruptions to health services and immunisation programmes. The Alliance is already helping countries adapt to the impacts of climate change by rolling out vaccines that protect against many of these diseases. This high-level panel will explore the role of immunisation systems in adapting to climate change and responding to pandemics.
